Begonia grandis	Unusual tuberous form. Beautiful foliage and <a href="#">pink</a> flowers	Tubers started for June transplant ~3" pot
<a href="#">Catalpa ovata</a>	Chinese Catalpa	2-3 Ft. +/-
Cornus kousa	from pink parent, lovely burgundy fall foliage,	several sizes ~3Ft.- 6Ft.
Digitalis purpurea	<a href="#">Foxgloves</a> (mostly pink forms) Tall biennial	Over wintered plants
Doronicum austriacum	Leopard's Bane(tall) <a href="#">Yellow</a> Needs to be dead-headed to prevent excessive "seeding off"	
Euonymus elata	Winged Euonymus, brilliant fall foliage. Compact form.	2Ft.+
February Daphne	Shrub/purple. Very early & fragrant	Very few 2-3Ft.
Filipendula rubrum	Queen of the Prairie, pink, med-tall, beautiful foliage	
Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle', &	Shrub, <a href="#">white flowers</a> 'Grandiflora' has very large blooms	Large crowned plants

Hydrangea grandiflora 'Quick Fire'	Pink truss, blooms earlier than PeeGee, very vigorous	
Hydrangea serrata 'Bluebird'	Blue bloom, flat headed, quite a hardy blue	Very few
Kerria , japanese	Shrub, Orange flower, attractive green stems	
NA-Kolwitzia (Beauty Bush)	Tall shrub, blooms late June/ <a href="#">Pink</a>	Very few - Large
Leucothoe fontaneisiana	Drooping evergreen shrub. Small white flowers in spring.	Requires some shade and a slightly sheltered location
NA Mock Orange	Fragrant white bloom, July Double form	Very few
Monarda didyma	Bee Balm / <a href="#">Red</a> Raspberry shade	
PEONIES	We may have a few species. P. obovata and P. officinalis No regular herbaceous types	These need to be accessed VERY early
NA-Paeonia suffruticosa	<a href="#">Tree Peony</a> , grown from seed 5+ years old. Mostly pink or white shades.	Blooming size, but maybe not this year.
Pieris japonica	Evergreen shrub, early spring bloom	Few only, quite small
Pulmonaria	Bethlehem Sage / early <a href="#">Pink</a> /Blue flowers on spotted foliage	
Rhododendron hybrids	semi-mature plants grown from seed, exact colors may be unknown. Many grown for good foliage.	Very difficult to access Inquire
NA Rhubarb	Good heavy roots from our "patch"	Need to be accessed very early
Sweet Woodruff	low growing ground cover, small white <a href="#">flowers</a> , spreads quite rapidly	
Vinca minor	Ground-cover , blue flowers	
Wiegela , dark red	Shrub, early summer bloom	Quite large
